Our Progress

- Green Port Policy

Air emissions down more than 90% since 2005.

Advancement toward zero emissions.

\$15 million awarded for community projects.

But there was still more work to do.





The Challenge

- How do we maintain compliance with state law?
- How do we address impacts other than air quality?
- How do we help those most impacted?
- How do we engage the community to help craft solutions?



- Worked closely with State Lands Commission to establish "nexus"
- Identified impacts other than air quality: traffic, noise, and water
- Pinpointed areas most impacted by port operations








Our Commitment

- \$46+ million in new funding to reduce our impacts
- Total of \$65 million with previous program
- Community-based projects
- \$3 million \$4 million in spending each year, up to 15 years

Results

- Since 2017, \$17.5 million for 47 community projects:
 - > \$6.6 million for 7 asthma-related health programs
 - > \$1.1 million for 19 air filtration/HVAC projects
 - > \$300,000+ for 2 energy efficiency projects
 - > \$4.5 million for 8 parks and open space projects
 - > \$3.1 million for 4 stormwater projects
 - > \$1.9 million for 7 solar generation/heating projects
- Adds to 125 projects previously funded 2009-2017



Outcomes


- Health care programs have reached more than 31,000 children, seniors, and adults through home visits, mobile health clinics, education, and community outreach.
- The Camp Fire Angeles eco-parking lot project replaced 11,487 square feet of the site's impermeable, asphalt parking lot with permeable pavement, reducing the amount of storm water that enters storm drains at this site by up to 70%.
- Stephens Middle School created an edible garden and fruit tree noise berm to improve the school and community environment for residents in West Long Beach. Trees planted will reduce greenhouse gases, rain barrels will capture and reuse water, and the garden will produce over 400 pounds of produce per year.


Equity Index Layers

Racial Equity Initiative


- Impact of COVID-19 was felt more profoundly in low-income communities and communities of color

- Engaged Esri to support their equity strategy and develop tools to inform decision-making







Sustainable Communities Program Overview

- Since 2005, the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) has provided resources and direct technical assistance to local jurisdictions via the Sustainable Communities Program (SCP).
- The 2020/21 SCP provided local agencies with three opportunities to access funding and resources to meet the needs of their communities, address recovery and resiliency strategies considering COVID-19, and support regional goals.
- SCAG will release a fourth Call for Applications for programs and projects prioritizing Civic Engagement, Equity & Environmental Justice in January, 2023.

SCP & SCAGs Racial Equity Action Plan

The Racial Equity Early Action Plan (REEAP), approved by the Regional Council in May 2021, established goals and a policy direction to advance racial equity through SCAG's programs.

SCP Call 4 directly supports the policy direction and Goal 3 of the Plan "Encourage Racial Equity in Local Planning"

- Provide resources for CBO engagement in Local Planning
- Refine equity goals and evaluation criteria used in the Sustainable Communities Program
- Provide resources through the Sustainable Communities Program to promote Environmental Justice

SCP Call 4 CEE&EJ Goals & Objectives



Support the development of plans to close the racial equity gap.



Support a range of eligible land use and transportation activities.



Prioritize efforts that benefit **Communities of Concern** and **SB 535 Disadvantaged Communities**.

Project Eligibility

This program is anticipated to include up to \$5M through a mix of funding sources, including the Regional Early Action Planning Grants of 2021 (REAP 2.0).

Call for Applications Co-Applicant Partnership Structure

Meeting community needs through local partnerships

- Local agency could apply with up to two CBO coapplicant(s).
 - CBOs would be compensated to lead key elements of the project via an MOU with SCAG.
 - A Consultant team could be procured to support the local agency and perform identified work.

Proposed Application & Evaluation Process



SCAG develops guidelines with feedback from regional partners



Applicants submit proposals



SCAG holds office hours and coaching to support applicants



Proposals are evaluated and awarded based on pre-determined criteria
