OVERVIEW

SoCal Goods Movement Communities Opportunities Assessment is led by Southern California Association of Governments and seeks to identify and assess the localized opportunities and impacts of the goods movement industry.

ASSESSMENT GOALS:



Help communities connect to workforce development opportunities related to the goods movement industry through an inclusive and transparent engagement process, as well as identify and develop co-generated solutions to goods movement challenges.



Assess the opportunities and impacts of the goods movement industry in 6-8 communities that are quantifiably and disproportionately affected by industry activities and/or facilities.



Pilot and evaluate innovative communication tools that can be replicated to create an equitable community engagement process on topics related to goods movement.



Provide community leaders and public officials with an opportunities toolkit that includes strategies to reduce health and air quality impacts, resources for connecting to economic benefits, and best practices for equitable community engagement.
